AVIAN INFLUENZA ALERT

You probably have seen in the news that poultry flocks on the east coast, in the southwest, and in Canada have tested positive for Avian Influenza. There are several points you need to know and should share with your fellow poultry fanciers and friends:

- + The strains of Avian Influenza that have recently been found in the United States are NOT the same as the strain that can be contagious to humans.
- +The strains of Avian Influenza currently being investigated in the United States are different from the Asian Bird Flu.
- +A highly pathogenic (Hi Path) strain of Avian Influenza was discovered in a chicken flock in Gonzales, Texas on February 23rd. The birds were being raised for the Live Bird Markets (LBN). 6,608 birds on this farm were depopulated. In addition, 2,300 birds at 5 LBM in Houston were also depopulated.
- +Routine swabbing picked up the Avian Influenza in Texas. Although the strain is categorized as Hi Path, no deaths in the chickens were observed.
- +Live poultry have been banned from the grounds of the Houston Livestock Show and Market due to the outbreak. A poultry judging contest and commercial egg clinic have been cancelled by the Texas Poultry Federation. Any gathering of poultry or poultry people is considered to be a biosecurity risk at this time.
- +The Hi Path strain isolated in Texas is NOT the same as the Bird Flu in Asia.
- +Low pathogenicity Avian Influenza was discovered in Maryland on March 5th. The flock of 118,000 chickens was depopulated. Two other farms owned by the same person and within a mile of the first farm, were also depopulated (some 200,000 additional chickens).
- +Surveillance for Avian Influenza is continuing in Delaware.
- +Remember the importance of "DelMarVa" (Delaware, Maryland, and Virginia when it comes to broiler production). Any flocks on the DelMarVa peninsula experiencing more than 3 deaths per 1000 birds are being tested.
- +A Hi Path strain of Avian Influenza has been found in a chicken flock in British Columbia. Importation of live poultry and poultry products from British Columbia was banned by USDA on March 10th.

Fur and Feathers is on the move at State Fair

Fur and Feathers will no longer be located at Expo Center. The lower grandstand area at the race track is being converted into a new Fur and Feathers area. The move will have poultry and the other small animals closer to the rest of the animal exhibits. However, we will still be in an air conditioned area. State Fair will have onsite security for after-hours supervision.

2004 Egg Preparation Qualifier Will another Californian capture the national title?

In 2003, California's Marta Kroger won the National 4-H Egg Preparation Demonstration Championship. Marta gave an excellent presentation on her strategies at this year's Avian Science Day. In addition, Marta has made videos and DVDs that illustrate preparing for and doing an actual Egg Preparation Demonstration. Diseases to the east, diseases to the north, what can I do?

With current airline schedules, Texas and British Columbia are just a few hours away from California. It has been a year since the last case of Exotic Newcastle Disease (END) in our state. With 12 months of poultry disease-free news in California, some people may be slipping back into their old, sloppy habits.

"Biosecurity always" should be your motto. Please dig out the materials you received in 2002-3 on Biosecurity and review them. You may also visit Dr. Ernst's website: http://animalscience.ucdavis.edu/Avian And look under "Disease Control and Biosecurity."

Should you experience sudden and high mortality in your flock, call the Avian Health and Mitigation Group of the California Department of Food and Agriculture: 1-800-491-1899 or 1-909-947-4462

When you have routine mortality (that is, you have just one bird die). Take advantage of the free diagnostic services offered to backyarders by the California Animal Health and Food Safety (CAHFS) System. You may get a list of all the CAHFS labs in the state by clicking on "IC Diagnostic Lab" on Dr. Ernst's website. Or, you may call the CAHFS Lab at Davis (530) 752-8700 to obtain the location and phone number of the lab nearest you.

Poultry Health Inspection (PHI) Certification Class

Our next scheduled class to train PHI is Tues., April 20 at the Earl Warren Show Grounds in Santa Barbara. PHIs are needed to conduct the mandatory health checks of poultry at all county, district, and state fairs.

You must be 19 years and older, or a high school graduate, to be eligible for training. Classes are limited to 30 individuals. If you wish to receive the training in Santa Barbara, you must register by calling Jeri Hansen at 530-752-9040. If you leave a voice message, clearly state your name, mailing address, and phone number. No fee to take the class. However, PHI will be paid for their services when they conduct health checks at the fairs.

You must pre-register; there will be NO on-site registration.
