

ETHICS TRAINING

Ethics training will be offered to those interested PRIOR to the start of the official AVS Day program on February 5th. Market Poultry (Broiler Pens and Meat Turkeys), market steer, and market lamb exhibitors at the 2005 California State Fair will be required to participate in a California State Fair Certified Quality Assurance Program and Ethics Training prior to the opening of the 2005 California State Fair.

Those exhibitors who received Tier III certification at AVS Day 2004 or at other location in 2004 do NOT need to repeat the training in 2005 (that was a 5 year certification). Attending a Certified Quality Assurance Program and Ethics Training Seminar in 2005 will fulfill the training requirement for 2005, 6,7,8 and 9. Other species groups may be added in the future.
